CRITERIA FOR THE
LLOYD NELSON CALMORE SCHOLARSHIP

I. Student eligibility:

- A regular attendee of Friendship Pasadena Church for at least one year and participates in ministries such as youth choir, usher board, Union Station, children's church, and dance ministry.
- Satisfactory or above academic and citizenship grades
- A record of satisfactory school attendance
- Evidence of community service (signature required - see attachment)

II. Applicant Requirements

- Completed application including the cover page, personal data form and the evidence of community service form signed by your supervisor
- Essay
- Optional family information submitted on a separate sheet of paper (any unusual circumstances which may affect your ability to meet college costs)
- Most recent official transcript (including SAT score and/or ACT score, and High School Exit Exam score)
- Two typed letters of recommendation from a counselor, teacher, or member of the community who knows you (no relatives)
- Application submitted in the exact order listed above to the Friendship Pasadena Church office
- DUE DATE – SECOND SUNDAY IN MAY

Help For the References

In selecting someone to write a letter of reference for you, you should consider a person who has known you well enough and long enough to write about your skills, character and anything else that might qualify you for a scholarship. It is also recommended that you help your references to be as complimentary as possible by reminding them of your strengths and accomplishments. Therefore, the answers to the following questions might be a helpful guide to give them:

- What is the reference's relationship to you?
 - ◆ Teacher/counselor
 - ◆ Community leader
 - ◆ Church leader
 - ◆ Other
- How long has the reference known you?
- What are your academic strengths that the reference would have knowledge of and should include in his/her correspondence?
- What extra-curricular activities does the reference have knowledge of that would enhance your chances of earning a scholarship?
- How have you demonstrated your leadership ability for the reference?
- What special talents do you have that the reference can brag about?
 - ◆ Athletic
 - ◆ Musical
 - ◆ Dramatic
 - ◆ Other

Make sure that anyone who is writing a letter on your behalf is doing so in a positive and supportive way. Remember to select your references early and to supply them with the above information in a timely manner.
